SUBJECT: Type (Generic) Accreditation of the Army Morale, Welfare, and Recreation
(MWR) Management Information System (MIS)

1. References:

2. I have reviewed the findings and recommendations presented in the U.S. Army CFSC MWR MIS SSAA (Reference 1d.). I have concluded that the safeguards and security features incorporated in this system will meet the minimum requirements for processing and storing information at the Sensitive But Unclassified (SBU) level in the Systems High Security Mode of Operation.

3. In accordance with Army Regulation 380-19 (Reference 1a.) the MWR MIS will be accredited every three years. In addition, the system must be reaccredited within three months after any of the occurrences noted in paragraph 3-6 of AR 380-19. The Project Manager (PM) of the MWR MIS AIS will conduct a generic reaccreditation within three months of any major system change.

4. The MWR MIS is supplied with a generic accreditation. Because of the variety of physical security conditions at the locations to which the system will be deployed, it is critical that the site-based risk assessments, described in Reference 1d., be conducted by the local Designated Approving Authorities (DAAs) to identify in-place safeguards

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and determine the appropriate level of physical protection necessary for the MWR MIS to process SBU in its local environment. In addition, the operators assume the responsibility to monitor the environment for compliance with the environment as described in the accreditation documentation.
